


What is a Prophet?

"One who speaks forth on behalf of God, the infallible declaration of divine revelation, often but not restricted to what will come to pass."

- Biblical Doctrine







What is a Prophet?


"A man of God"

False Prophets

Those who speak for God "falsely." They appear in the Old Testament as:

- Pagan "false prophets" (1 Kings 18:19)
- Court "false prophets" (Jeremiah 28)



So that by two unchangeable things, *in which it is impossible for God to lie*, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to hold fast to the hope set before us.




