

Who are the Prophets?


The Messengers

- Ministered to Judah (see 1:1).






- Micah means "who is like Yahweh."

Covenant Violation: Micah

"All this is for the transgression of Jacob and for the sins of the house of Israel. What is the transgression of Jacob? Is it not Samaria? And what is the high place of Judah? Is it not Jerusalem?"

"Make yourselves bald and cut off your hair for the children of your delight; make yourselves as bald as the eagle, *for they shall go from you into exile.*"


The Mountain of the LORD: Isaiah



- **Habakkuk** wrestled with the fundamental questions of life...



Complaint: Habakkuk

"O LORD, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not hear? Or cry to you 'Violence!' and you will not save? Why do you make me see iniquity, and why do you idly look at wrong?"

- Habakkuk 1:2-3

Complaint: Habakkuk

"You who are of purer eyes than to see evil and cannot look at wrong, why do you idly look at traitors and remain silent when the wicked swallows up the man more righteous than he?"

- Habakkuk 1:13






Q: Why don't you do something about the injustice in Judah (1:2-4)?

- A: I am. I'm raising up the Chaldeans/Babylonians (1:5-11).
- Q: *How can that be right* (1:12-2:1)?
- A: Wait, judgment is coming (2:2-20).
- Conclusion: *I will wait & rejoice!* (3)
