

Technology's Access


- The Good: Connecting people, helpful content,

"The push to maximize female labour"

Old-school feminism was supposed to be about letting women choose their own lifestyles. Some might want to stay home to raise a family, while others might want to pursue a career instead.

There wasn't supposed to be a wrong choice — the point was to give women equal treatment in the workplace, not force them there.

Rather than old-school feminism, Canada has adopted capital-L Liberal feminism. It seeks to push women in a particular direction rather than allow free choice. If life becomes too unaffordable for a family to subsist on one income, that's OK — forcing mom into the workplace generates tax revenue and improves the nation's gender equality statistics.

It's budget season, so you're about to see a lot of marketing about the female labour force participation rate, gender equality, daycare funding and maybe even talk of another "feminist budget." That's just the window dressing; the idea behind it all is to grow the labour pool and make GDP gains while sounding progressive and inspiring.

In his final years Hughes abruptly moved his residence from one place to another (The Bahamas, Nicaragua, Canada, England, Las Vegas, Mexico). As was the case with the Desert Inn, he took elaborate precautions to ensure absolute privacy in a luxury hotel and was rarely seen by anyone except a few male aides. Often working for days without sleep in a black-curtained room, he became emaciated and deranged from the effects of a meagre diet and an excess of drugs. In 1976 he died on a flight from Acapulco, Mexico, to Houston, Texas, to seek medical treatment.
